What is the AZ-MAP Program?

AZ-MAP is the pilot of an educational opportunity, with instructional pathways and self-guided education centred around the needs of individual emerging theatre performers, giving two participants agency in their education and achieving their professional theatre goals.

The program is a blend of:

- Instructional classes
- Apprenticeship based learning
- Theatre process shadowing
- One-on-one mentoring
- Artistic and administrative skill development

These skills will set participants up for success in their growing arts practices in their future endeavours. <u>Learn more about the program here!</u>

We are looking for two emerging theatre performers-in-process!

Many experiences and stories have yet to be shared on our stages. We acknowledge this and actively strive to change it.

This program is for those who have yet to find their stories on stage and those who have encountered barriers to creating, sharing and/or experiencing theatre training. We are here to learn and make lasting, meaningful change together.

We are actively searching for applicants who identify with historically underrepresented communities, and this can mean many intersections of identity and experience. If this applies to you, this program is for you.



What we can offer:

Participants will be paid to train and learn while working in an apprenticeship role with the Azimuth Theatre producing team. Azimuth will provide weekly part-time theatre training and mentorship with highly supported administration work, providing folks with the opportunity to learn applicable skills for a life in the arts.

Contract Fee

\$12,000

Consistent for the length of the contract, paid twice monthly (for a total of \$1500 per month, which approximates to 18.75\$/hour of scheduled time). No classes on stat holidays and instructional break from December 20th, 2021 - January 3rd, 2022

Timeline

32 Week Contract over ~8 months

Program Details

Workshops

 Focused educational opportunities that will be instructed with the intention of exploring a specific facet of artistic practice, with industry professionals facilitating. These workshops will be open to all Azimuth Staff and the AZ-MAP team to learn alongside participants.

Instructors

 Instructors will teach classes based on the <u>focus of the program</u> as described above

Apprenticeship Time

 Participants will work with Azimuth Theatre producers to learn more about the business side of theatre, learning about G Suite, QuickBooks, email, video/self-tape editing, social media and more.

Rehearsal Shadowing

 Participants will observe theatre processes with various companies at various stages in the creation process and experience the professional industry. First reads, auditions, script readings, tech, opening nights and more.

• Support People

 Support People will share space with the AZ-MAP participants outside of instructional hours to provide feedback and listen to the participants as third-party, objective listeners. Support People will share similar intersections as the participants and are meant to provide advice and share wisdom.

Mentors

Mentors will work with participants to shape their artistic practice, providing the hands-on support needed to finesse the skills every emerging artist needs to learn. Mentors are meant to not only provide insight and support but allyship and mutual support beyond the program in the professional theatre community as the AZ-MAP participants build their careers in this industry.

In-person or online

(The class platform is negotiable and able to shift depending on factors in and out of our control, like Alberta Public Safety Guidelines and Azimuth Theatre's Health and Safety Policies)

Participant Responsibilities:

- Attending classes and actively participating in program activities and events
 - classes online or in-person in relation to the team's health, safety and comfort level.
- Attend company training opportunities
- Contributing to the Azimuth Theatre team administration, in a highly supported capacity. (i.e social media, grant writing support, captioning, email communication, Expanse Festival support, etc.)
 - The Azimuth team will be there to support and provide guidance throughout this part of the AZ-MAP journey; this is the apprenticeship portion of the program, exploring the business of theatre and the responsibilities of a self-employed artist.

- Letter, video or audio recording explaining:
 - Who you are
 - Your artistic goals/practice as a performer
 - Tell us about the artistic experiences you're most proud of contributing to, and why the AZ-MAP would be a good fit for you.

(No longer than 500 words, or 5 mins)

- o Resume relating to you, your art and work
 - If you want guidance or support in creating your resume and application, we are here to help!
 - We also have a resume template available for you to use here
- 1 References may be called/contacted
 - This reference does not necessarily need to be performance-related, it can be a teacher, employer, community member. Someone who knows you are and your connection to the theatre!
